Shannon & Bill Ferrah: 1400 block of Freas Ave. Flooding problem of their property with regard to culvert that runs along street. Council suggested Jack Kyttle contact Quad 3 come take a look.

Frank Berbeck: Asking if any update on the water problem on 3rd Ave? Borough Manager Scoblink said he talked to BAJSA and they said that have done all they are going to do. He asked that someone come down and look at the problem. With winter coming this area freezes up. The Borough Manager will come to look at the problem next time it rains.

Next issue is the old railroad bed that the club purchased and is in the process of cleaning up right now. The clubs concern is the alley behind there that the borough owns and they would like to see the borough clean up the alley area.

Andrew Shecktor: Wants to put this sidewalk issue to bed.
