• Wayne Risch, 7564 Columbia Blvd. - Reports that his mother owns 604/606 Maple St., which is one of the homes that were being considered for demolition with 2020 CDBG funds. Reports that due to his mother's failing health, he just became aware that this was the case when he saw a letter that had been sent in February. Requested that Council give him an opportunity to rehab the property. Council agreed to give him until next month to discuss with codes what he would need to do, and determine whether or not he will. In doing so, Council also agreed to not finalize a list of properties for demolition.

- Fireworks Increased police presence over 4th of July weekend led to increased contacts. Warnings were given. Still work to do moving forward, but apparent progress.
- 2. Burning in the Borough Reiterated that Fire Chief needs to respond to calls regarding illegal burning. Council confirmed that they are in favor of allowing residents to have small fires for cooking in commercially produced fire pits, as is presently allowed.

 - e. There has recently been a couple individuals experiencing homelessness at Ber-Vaughn Park. Borough Manager will continue to work on this concern, while making efforts to offer assistance with connecting with available resources.
