§ 123-1. Unlawful acts.

From and after the enactment of this chapter, it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to:

- A. Race the motor of any motorcycle at any time of the day or night, whether in or on the streets or on private property.
- B. Have the motor of any motorcycle running while the motorcycle is parked, except when starting or stopping or when stopped for a stop sign, traffic signal or normal traffic conditions.
- C. Operate a motorcycle in, on or over the streets of the Borough of Berwick or run the motor of a motorcycle upon private property with a muffler from which the baffle plates, screen or other original internal parts have been removed and not replaced or the exhaust system of which has been modified in a manner which will amplify or increase the noise made by the motor above that emitted by the muffler originally installed on the motorcycle.
- D. Operate a motorcycle in, on or over the streets of the Borough of Berwick or run the motor of a motorcycle upon private property unless said motorcycle is equipped with a muffler and exhaust system in good working order, in constant operation and of such design and engineering as to prevent loud, excessive or unusual noise.

§ 123-2. Violations and penalties.¹

Any person violating the provisions of this chapter shall, upon conviction thereof before the District Justice, pay a fine of not less than \$5 nor more than \$300 for the use of the borough, to be collected as like fines or penalties by law are collected, and in default of payment of same, may be committed for not more than 30 days.
